Adoption Application

Please fill out this application as completely as possible and submit it, along with a \$50.00 (Canadian) application fee, to the address above. Your application fee will be deducted from your final adoption fee of \$650 for dogs age 0 - 7 years and \$450 for dogs over 7 years (Canadian funds). The adoption fee helps cover the costs of preparing our dogs for adoption (vet examination, spay/neuter, tattoo/microchip, vaccinations, teeth cleaning, if necessary, de-worming etc.) and also includes a martingale collar, a leash, a dog tag and a kennel muzzle.

The Adoption Application is not an agreement to adopt a dog. More questions may follow, plus an interview, vet reference check, and possibly a home/fence check - but this will get us started. We will use your answers as a starting point to work with you to determine, first, whether a Greyhound is really what you're looking for. If it is, we will also be able to help you select a pet who will fit in well with your lifestyle and expectations. Some individuals may find this process a bit intrusive, but we have found that thorough evaluation of our dogs and of prospective adopters helps to ensure that our placements are successful and permanent.
